# Smithsonian Institution - Collections Emergency Kit Survey

22 Smithsonian collecting units were surveyed to get a better understanding of their collections emergency kit contents and management. This is a summary of the results from that survey.

### **Top 30 Most Frequent Emergency Kit Supplies:**

## Major Recommendations:

- · Utilize floorplans to identify kit locations
- Consider maximizing access to the kits through training
- · Don't forget about supplies that expire! (batteries, tape, gloves, etc.)
- · Perforated zip-ties and tamper-proof tape can help to minimize supply pilfering while also serving as a reminder to do an inventory
- · It is useful to maintain both an inventory list online and a physical one within emergency kits to mark off used supplies
- · Clearly identify leadership for kit maintenance
- · Mobility is an incredibly important kit feature
- Be creative when it comes to kit supplies!


